### How to Judge a Member's Voting Record

AFSCME selects a few roll-call votes from the hundreds cast by members of Congress every session. In choosing these votes, AFSCME attempts to fairly represent a lawmaker's position on issues determined to be important to AFSCME members — first and foremost as workers, but also as citizens and union brothers and sisters.

This voting scorecard is one of the key factors used in making judgments on AFSCME campaign support, endorsements or contributions from PEOPLE — AFSCME's Political Action Committee or PAC. Other important factors often include the member's official leadership position, chairmanship or seniority on important committees, leadership in a state's congressional delegation, and accessibility and responsiveness to AFSCME's lobbying efforts.

## 2017 HOUSE VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

### 1. Blocking New Public Health, Worker and Consumer Protections

#### AFSCME Position: No

The REINS Act (H.R. 26) would require the House and Senate to approve any major rule issued by a federal agency within a 70-day window. If either body failed to approve the regulation, it would not be implemented. This bill would slow or block rules designed to safeguard the public's health, improve job safety, reduce financial fraud, protect the environment or even keep our food supply safe. The bill passed the House on January 5 by a vote of 237-187. Roll Call vote 23.

### 2. Paving the Way to Repeal the Affordable Care Act

#### AFSCME Position: No

This budget resolution (S. Con. Res. 3) set up a process to allow congressional leaders to secretly draft a bill that would repeal of the Affordable Care Act and cut Medicaid without getting public input or going through the normal legislative process to allow for bipartisan discussion. The resolution passed the House on January 13 by a vote of 227-198. Roll Call vote 58. This resolution was also approved by the Senate and did not require action by the President to be implemented.

### 3. Undermining Worker Safety

#### AFSCME Position: No

This bill (H.J. Res. 83) repealed a rule issued by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) that requires employers to keep accurate injury and illness records. These records help to identify working conditions that put workers at greatest risk. The regulation had been in place for decades but was overturned by a court in 2012. This bill repealed the clarifying rule issued by OSHA following the court's decision. The bill passed the House on March 1 by a vote of 231-191. Roll Call vote 121. This bill became law on April 3.

### 4. Stripping Basic Protections from Veterans Affairs Workers

#### AFSCME Position: No

This bill (H.R. 1259) would eliminate the right of health care providers employed by Veterans Affairs facilities to use the collectively bargained grievance procedure to challenge any disciplinary action. Other workers could not use the grievance procedure for disciplinary actions to fight a dismissal, demotion or lengthy suspension. Dismissals, demotions and suspensions could not be reduced upon appeal, regardless of the facts. The bill passed the House on March 16 by a vote of 237-178. Roll Call vote 168.

### 5. Undermining Overtime Pay

#### AFSCME Position: No

This bill (H.R. 1180) would weaken overtime pay protections for private sector workers by allowing employers to substitute compensatory time off and to schedule it at an employer's convenience. The bill would reduce take-home pay for millions of workers, lead to longer hours and more unpredictable schedules. The bill passed the House on May 2 by a vote of 229-197. Roll Call vote 244.

### 6. Repealing the Affordable Care Act and Gutting Medicaid

#### AFSCME Position: No

The American Health Care Act (H.R. 1628) would repeal the Affordable Care Act (ACA) causing 24 million to lose their health care coverage, drive up premiums for those with pre-existing conditions and undermine the solvency of Medicare. The bill also would cut and restructure Medicaid, leading to a loss of home care and nursing home services for the frail, elderly and people with disabilities. The bill passed the House on May 4 by a vote of 217-213. Roll Call vote 256.

## 7. Weakening Labor Standards and Cutting Public Services

### AFSCME Position: No

This bill (H.R. 3354) would drastically cut funding for public services carried out by state and local governments. In addition, the bill had several anti-labor provisions that would undermine collective bargaining rights, weaken minimum wage protections for seasonal workers and undermine job safety. The bill passed the House on September 14 by a vote of 211-198. Roll Call vote 528.

## 8. Cuts in Spending to Pay for Tax Cuts for Wealthy

### AFSCME Position: No

The House budget resolution (H. Con. Res. 71) established a 10-year blueprint for the federal budget that would raise the eligibility for Medicare from age 65 to 67 and make massive cuts to Medicaid, food stamps, education, transportation and other public services in order to pay for huge tax cuts for millionaires, billionaires and big corporations. The resolution passed the House on October 5 by a vote of 219-206. Roll Call vote 557.

## 9. Paving the Way for Massive Tax Cuts

### AFSCME Position: No

A modified budget resolution (H.Res. 580) would set up a process to allow congressional leaders to draft a major tax cut bill in secret, without getting public input or going through the normal legislative process to allow for bipartisan discussion. The resolution passed the House on October 25 by a vote of 233-188. Roll Call vote 583. This resolution was also approved by the Senate and did not require action by the President to be implemented.

## 10. Weakening Job Protections for Federal Workers

### AFSCME Position: No

This bill (H.R. 4182) would extend the probationary period for most federal employees from one year to two years, doubling the time during which federal workers could be fired without cause. The bill also would limit the ability of union stewards and officers to adequately represent their members. The bill passed the House on November 30 by a vote of 213-204. Roll Call vote 648.

## 11. Cutting Taxes for the Wealthy and Corporations

### AFSCME Position: No

The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (H.R. 1) cuts taxes for the wealthy and corporations, while raising taxes on millions of working families over the long run. The bill encourages corporations to move jobs overseas and changes the Affordable Care Act in a way that will cause 13 million people to lose their health coverage. The bill increases deficits by \$1.5 trillion over 10 years, increasing pressure to cut spending on education, transportation and other public services. The bill passed the House on December 20 by a vote of 224-201. Roll Call vote 699. The bill became law on December 22.
